





It gives me immense pride to present the Quarterly Report for Q2 (July–September 2025), a period that truly reflects the heart, purpose, and spirit of Padala Charitable Trust. As I look through the pages of this newsletter, I am reminded once again of the extraordinary strength that emerges when committed teams, supportive partners, and passionate communities come together for one mission – to ensure every child is safe, educated, and empowered.

This quarter has been an inspiring journey across Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. From the heartwarming engagement of thousands of families in the Mega Parent–Teacher Meetings in East Godavari to the powerful start of Vaaradhi 2025 across seven schools reaching over 300 vulnerable children with mentorship, dignity kits, life skills, and hope, our work has touched lives in meaningful ways.

Our SFLB Personal Safety Education program, now active in five districts and reaching 49,000+ children, continues to be one of our most impactful contributions to preventing child sexual abuse at scale. Equally uplifting was the SET session at JNTUK, where 200 first-year students began their college life with confidence, motivation, and purpose.

This quarter also marked 10 years of Swechha, a milestone that celebrates our commitment to adolescent girls' health, dignity, and awareness. The anniversary event at St. Ann's Girls High School brought 350 young girls together in a safe, stigma-free environment to learn, question, and grow.

Our recognition by district authorities – including being invited to join the District Level Inspection Committee (DLIC) for Child Care Institutions – is a testament to the trust placed in PCT's consistent and compassionate work for children's safety and wellbeing.

The Vendor Meet reminded us that our journey is strengthened not only by donors and volunteers, but also by the many silent pillars – tailors, printers, drivers – who have grown with us over the last decade.



### ◆ Dhwani SAT Assessment

PCT achieved an impressive 98.5% in uploading 205 Niranthara Sahayak parameters across 8 modules, securing 3rd position nationally.

### ◆ Strategic Vision 2025–28

Our three-year roadmap has been finalized, focusing on organizational growth, impactful programs, and strengthened fundraising initiatives.

### ◆ Financial Update

Q1 donations have reached Rs. 80 Lakhs, and we continue to uphold employee welfare through family health insurance and PF benefits.

Our flagship programs—Vaaradhi, Unnath, and SFLB—are progressing strongly with renewed focus on achieving outcomes and increasing community engagement.

Padala Charitable Trust proudly participated in five Mega Parent-Teacher Meetings across Kakinada & Konaseema Districts, bringing together parents, students, teachers, and community leaders to celebrate progress and strengthen school-home connections.

### Key Highlights

- Stronger Parent Engagement: Thousands of parents participated across five schools, creating a warm, family-like atmosphere.
- Student Talent on Display: Cultural programs, sports achievements, and academic milestones lit up every campus.
- Vaaradhi Program Impact: Parents shared emotional stories on how Vaaradhi is supporting single/no-parent children and helping them overcome challenges.
- School of Excellence (SOE) Progress: Improvements seen in academics, life skills, digital learning, sports, and infrastructure—thanks to dedicated donors.
- Child Safety Awareness: Sessions on POCSO, Child Helpline 1098, and personal safety created strong awareness among students and parents.
- Community Support: Respected leaders and teachers joined hands to motivate students and appreciate their growth.




## Vaaradhi 2025 – A Strong and Impactful

Vaaradhi 2025 across 22 schools in Kakinada & Konaseema (July– September) with enthusiastic participation from students, parents, mentors, and volunteers.

- Over 374 students (girls & boys) from Grades 8–10 took part in the Phase-1 sessions.
- Each event began with open discussions, where students shared their experiences and hopes for the year.
- Students had mentoring sessions to understand their background, health needs, interests, and career goals.
- Dress measurements, innerwear distribution, and Swechha / Sethu Books were provided to ensure dignity, comfort, and learning support.
- Interactive sessions introduced:
  - SET Life Skills Training
  - Swechha Program (Hygiene, Nutrition, Myths, Menstrual Awareness)
  - Career Guidance (Intermediate streams, Polytechnic, ITI, vocational options)
- Parents participated in some locations, sharing challenges and strengthening school-home partnership.
- Surveys such as Life Skills, Swechha, and Sethu were conducted to tailor upcoming training sessions.

# SFLB is implemented in 5 districts of AP and Telangana



SFLB program is now active in five districts across Andhra Pradesh and Telangana — Kakinada, West Godavari, Kothagudem, NTR, and Srikakulam.

## Our Growing Impact

- 568 schools reached
- 49,000+ children educated on personal safety and protection

Local teams shared their happiness in being part of a program focused on preventing child sexual abuse. Their experiences show how deeply the sessions are resonating with children, teachers, and parents.

## SET Session at JNTUK

**14 August 2025 | JNTU Kakinada**

Over 200 first-year students participated in a powerful Student Empowerment Training (SET) session designed to build confidence, leadership, and purpose as they begin their college journey.

### Session Highlights

- Leadership & Self-Motivation Talks
- Inspiring Real-Life Stories
- Motivational Videos
- Interactive Group Activities that boosted confidence, teamwork, and clarity

The session reminded students that leadership isn't a position — it's about taking action, growing with purpose, and believing in yourself.

## **Swechha Celebrates 10 Years of Empowering Adolescent Girls**

Swechha marked a special milestone this year – 10 years of creating awareness, breaking stigma, and empowering young girls with knowledge and confidence.

The anniversary celebration was held at St. Ann's Girls High School, bringing together 350 students from Grades 8 and 9 for an engaging and meaningful session. The session included myth-busting discussions and interactive activities, making learning both fun and impactful.

A heartfelt thank you to our Chief Guest, Mr. CH. Ravi (MEO, Kakinada Urban) for inspiring the students, and to our generous donor Saransh Inc. for supporting this decade-long journey.



# Women Safety & Rights Workshop



The PCT team had the privilege of serving as resource persons at the Women Safety & Rights Workshop organized by WDCW, Kakinada District. Our Swechha for Little Birds (SFLB) team presented an impactful skit on Personal Safety

- The power of awareness within families
- That non-contact sexual abuse is punishable under POCSO Sec. 11 & 13
- That boys too can be victims, often harmed by known individuals

We also emphasized that child safety and rights form the foundation for true women's safety and long-term empowerment.

Kakinada is setting a strong example with mandal-level teams being trained in child protection, offering a model for other districts to follow.

## Swechha Session




Reliance Industries Limited (CSR), in collaboration with Padala Charitable Trust, conducted Project Swechha sessions in the Gadimoga region, reaching 200 adolescent girls across six schools.

### Key Learning Areas

- Understanding adolescence and reproductive health
- Menstrual hygiene and safe practices
- Importance of nutrition
- Emotional awareness during periods
- Introduction to sustainable menstrual products through the Happy Periods activity

A Class 10 girl, who shared: "Now I understand how important it is to stay clean during periods, and I will follow proper hygiene practices."


Impact: The sessions created a safe, stigma-free environment where girls spoke openly, asked questions, and gained confidence.

# Science Workshops


