

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# Story of the Founder: <u>ART OF PAYING IT FORWARD</u>



This talk traces a **software-engineer-turned philanthropist's** inspiring journey from making it out of a cycle of poverty to dedicating his life to paying it forward. Surya Prasad Padala post-graduated (M.Tech) from IIT Kharagpur (class of 1996). After working for 16 years in the US as a software consultant, he resigned from his job at the age of 40 and returned to India for good in 2012. Since then, he has dedicated his life to volunteering for non-profits and exploring opportunities where his talent can be used to make a positive difference in society.

One thing that drives Surya Prasad's passion is the idea of paying it forward. He hailed from a lower middle-class background, where his father was a tailor in his village. After achieving state rank in his 10th and 12th class boards, he was financially assisted by an organization called BREAD to complete his B.Tech education. This made a huge difference in Surya Prasad's life and is what motivated him to pay it forward on his own. He has since been instrumental in the design and streamlining of several initiatives over the years at his organization Padala Charitable Trust since 2002. # Sense of Urgency — Reasons to Collaborate and act Fast

# Meaning & Purpose of Education

- All Stakeholders are still struggling with this including highly educated officials and bureaucrats
- Education in schools and colleges is mostly syllabus-centric and entrance exam based. Rote Learning is given utmost importance and unfortunately there is no mention of Life Skills, Higher Order Thinking Skills in classroom or at home.
- Joy of learning is missing in the system
- Questioning & Critical Thinking is not at all encouraged in the classroom.

# Serious decline in commitment levels

- Majority of the Teachers, School Leaders (HMs, Principals) and Officials at all levels lack the required commitment in spite of their level of knowledge and experience.
- Not many realise the importance of being part of Education Department which actually drives all the departments.
- Worst of all, there is a strong opposition for honest and committed teachers from their colleagues and higherups. Lack of unbiased and consistent monitoring from higher officials is one of the main reasons for this situation.
- Absence of harmony in schools is impacting the learning outcomes and hence the lives of millions of children. This issue deserves serious attention at all levels.

# Lack of Awareness in Parental Community

- Lack of Awareness in Parental Community about the needs of their children. The parents are equally confused about the education, career and life. The illiterate and semi-literate families lack the required understanding of the system and what is really needed for their children.
- The problem with many educated families is even worse. They are obsessed with the ranks and grades and hardly pay attention to the child's interest and talent. They get so carried away by the marketing and promotion of corporate schools and colleges.
- Many parents don't even show interest to participate in the school committee meetings and hence they loose an opportunity to assess and question the system.

# Challenges for Adolescent Boys and Girls

- Distractions There are enough distractions around to keep the youth occupied and confused. They are tempted to explore a lot more through internet and social media than through text books, teachers and other reliable sources.
- \* Behavioural Changes By nature, adolescence is the age of curiosity, exploration, identity crisis and emotional imbalance. They need special attention at home and in school to make sure they are positively engaged and their energy levels are effectively channelized.
- They get frustrated while dealing with things like menstrual hygiene, attraction (same gender & opposite gender) and peer pressure which are very common challenges in adolescents. They badly need timely help here.

# Appeal to Join Hands for Making a Difference



Adolescents in semi-urban and rural India are deprived of quality education, life skills and employability skill training, which makes it challenging for them to deal with the demands of adolescent and adult life.

There is very strong reason WHY we are concerned about the current status of youth in India. There are FIVE major problems that we generally notice in the children from schools and colleges in the current system of education:

- 1. Lack of Self-Awareness I don't believe in myself, I lack self-confidence. I give up on many things without realizing my full potential. I focus more on my weaknesses (W) and threats (T) rather than my strengths (S) and the opportunities (O) around me.
- 2. Lack of Employability Skills I study, I score marks, grades and ranks, get a degree BUT I cannot speak with confidence, I cannot even prepare a simple power point presentation and I cannot express myself. I am NOT employable....How can an Employer hire me? There is a definite lack of employability skills in close to 80% of the graduates today. The school education system doesn't create enough awareness about 21st century skills such as Critical Thinking, Creativity, Communication and Collaboration.
- 3. Stressful and low quality Education The whole system is madly running after marks/grades and there is hardly any text book that teaches me how to handle my failures, manage stress in my life, how do I become a leader and WHY should I be a socially responsible person. There is absolutely NO place for such life skills in the curriculum. Moreover, too much rote learning still prevails AND copying and malpractices in the examination system drives us crazy and very few care about value education. The stress is all over on students, parents as well as on teachers. The next generation is in trouble and this has to change.
- 4. Adolescent Health Education I am an adolescent girl / boy going through lot of physical and emotional changes in me. I have several questions about things like menstrual hygiene, reproductive health, peer pressure and emotions that I go through but I don't have a reliable source whom I can freely share my feelings with. Half knowledge on these things is causing severe damage to my deep understanding of essential things in my life. There is not enough awareness on adolescent health education for boys and girls in high schools and colleges. The situation is worse in most of the private institutions.
- 5. No Career Guidance Last but not least, there is absolutely no idea about my <u>Career Options</u>. If I have a strong passion towards teaching and want to become a teacher, I do not know how far I should study, what competition I need to go through AND the kind of difference I can make in the society as a teacher. There is NO process in place to help me plan my career. This creates lot of confusion when I need to make a decision about my career.

# The majority of adolescent (youth) in India are completely directionless, demoralized and demotivated.

We take so much pride in saying that India will be youngest in the world by 2030 with an average age of 29 years. We think we are the most energetic. But what we don't realize is how that energy can become a negative force and destroy the whole system IF not channeled in right direction. That's exactly what we are witnessing today. Rampant crime rate and sexual abuse cases among youth, consistent suicides and anxiety cases in schools & colleges, number of broken families; they all speak bitter truth about the unhealthy and unacceptable status of the society we live in today. Most of the youth is totally misled at school age (< 15 Yrs). Our children need help. They need some direction, motivation, leadership and career guidance right at the school age.

We need to understand the <u>sense of urgency</u>. The problem is <u>too serious to ignore</u>. We have to intervene into the system and make a positive difference in the society by making our children realize their own potential and help them become both successful and responsible citizens AND <u>make India a</u> better place to live in.

Sense of Urgency — The adolescent are not given right awareness at right age on right things in a right way. The initiatives like School Of Excellence can do this magic.


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
